



### Adventure Details

#### *Do I need to be a licensed skydiver?*

No. All skydives will be done in tandem with a skydiving professional.

#### *If I am a licensed skydiver, can I jump solo?*

No. This is a very specialized, high altitude jump, using very specialized equipment. All skydivers must jump tandem with one of our experienced high-altitude tandem masters. Jumping tandem does have its benefits. You can just kick back and enjoy the view while someone else does the flying.

*What about video?* You'll be trained in the use of a wristcam, allowing you to shoot your own jump video. In addition, you'll receive a copy of additional Mt McKinley Skydive footage taken by our staff videographer.

*What's this cost?* The price is \$25,000. The cost includes all jump training, use of jump equipment, a Mt McKinley skydive and air-taxi flight from the drop zone back to Talkeetna. We've also included five nights at the Talkeetna Lodge and a meal or two.

*What's not included?* Air travel to and from Talkeetna, most meals & incidentals.

## Mt McKinley—The Great One

Legally, it's still Mt McKinley, but to residents of Alaska and mountain climbers, North America's tallest peak is known as Denali, a word that means "the great one". (There's an ongoing battle to change the mountain's name.) Standing 20,320 feet tall, McKinley has a larger bulk and rise than Mt Everest.

### HALO Jump vs HAHO Jump

A military HALO jump calls for you to jump high and open your chute low, in order to avoid detection by the enemy. Military HAHO jumps call for you to exit high and pull the chute almost immediately, allowing you to travel a great distance under canopy. If you needed to jump out of a plane in the US but land across the border in Canada, you'd make a HAHO jump. Our Denali Skydives will be a hybrid of the two skydiving techniques. Our military-style jump mission calls for a high altitude jump over McKinley and deployment of chutes soon after so you have the maximum time in the air to shoot video and enjoy the view before coming to land in a soft pile of snow.

### Saturday, June 20

Arrive Anchorage, Alaska. Fly, drive or take a train or bus to Talkeetna. Check in to your mountain view room at the Talkeetna Lodge. Stop by the Denali Skydive Hospitality Suite to receive the latest schedule of training and activities and preview jump equipment. Evening free to relax or mingle with staff and other skydiving participants.

### Sunday, June 21

We're arranging something fun and touristy for you to do in the early part of the day. (Participation is optional, but we'd like you to see a bit of Alaska while getting to know other skydive participants.) Report to the Denali Skydive Hospitality Suite around 4 pm to begin your high-altitude Denali jump training. Estimated training time is three to four hours. After you're fully-briefed and ready to skydive, we'll feed you dinner and send you to bed, so you're well-rested for the adventure ahead.

### Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, June 22-24

Three days have been set aside for skydives to allow for possible weather delays. The **order** you jump is determined by the date your deposit is received in IA's Florida Office, but the **day** you skydive will be determined by Mother Nature. Please remember to pack your patience. You could find yourself hanging out at the airport awhile, waiting for weather to clear. We want the conditions for your incredible skydive over Mt McKinley to be as perfect as they can be.

## The Denali Skydive Team

You'll skydive over Mt McKinley with a group of men who began their skydiving careers in the US military. In their civilian lives, they have gone on to achieve some of the highest ratings issued by the United States Parachute Association (USPA). Kevin Holbrook and his team have completed more high-altitude tandem jumps than anyone else in the country.



Kevin's group is called upon to train NATO forces from around the world in military freefall and his company is the only organization approved by the FAA to conduct tandem skydives at altitudes higher than 28,000 feet.

The team's Tandem Master Instructor Examiner Ratings attest to their ability to teach and certify other tandem instructors. Their Safety & Training Advisor credentials confirm their focus and training in areas of safety. Their prestigious PRO ratings attest to their ability to land with extreme accuracy, in small spaces, while facing challenging conditions. Ben Crowell is an FAA-certified Senior Master Rigger and Jim Horak is a Flight Surgeon. Neagle Ledet is a former Ranger and is the team's Safety Officer and videographer.

Joining the team for the Denali Skydive will be Canadian skydiving instructor Neil Jones, one of the first to Skydive Everest.
